



EMPOWERING PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES THROUGH DIGITAL

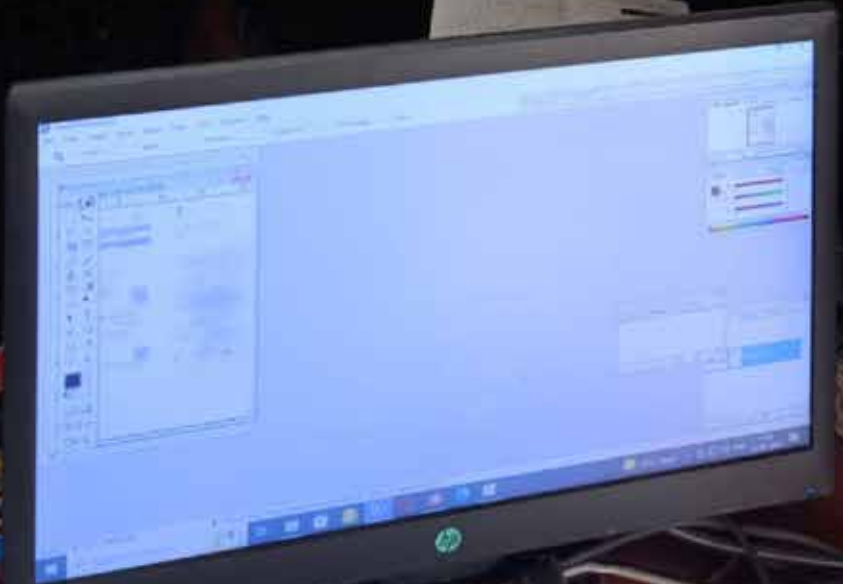
Narrative Report



With the support of EquallyAble Foundation, DEF took the role of implementing partner the EquallyAble Foundation's Hope-1000 project in India with the aim to identify 500 persons with disabilities across 7 states to digitally enable them to become sustainable village level entrepreneurs who not only earn a livelihood for themselves but are also able to serve the community.

The alignment of Hope1000's vision and DEF's mission to connect the unconnected ensured that PWDs were enabled to become self-sustainable, integrate into the entrepreneurship model and lead a dignified life. To do this, they were trained in functional digital literacy. The person was then equipped with a tablet phone and a printer-scanner, and encouraged to become an entrepreneur who can provide a wide range of digital services to community members. These services could range from digital literacy for community members; eTicketing facility; scanning, photocopying or printing services; information delivery on public schemes and entitlements; facilitation of application submission for public schemes and entitlements etc.

Hence, this programme provided the person with disability with an independent profession to support his or her family's livelihood, subsequently providing them with respect and dignity to feel confident and valued.

Introduction



India is home to a diverse population of over 1.3 billion people, with approximately 80 million of them living with some form of disability. Despite the efforts of the Indian government to promote inclusion through various policies and schemes, persons with disabilities (PwDs) continue to face numerous challenges, such as low literacy rates, limited job opportunities, and widespread social stigma. As a result, PwDs in India are among the most excluded and marginalized segments of society. In recent years, there has been a growing recognition of the potential of digital technologies to drive inclusive development and transform the lives of PwDs. By harnessing the power of digital tools and resources, PwDs can not only access vital information and services but also develop new skills and create opportunities for sustainable livelihoods. In this context, the Hope1000 project was conceived as a groundbreaking initiative to leverage digital technologies to empower PwDs and create 500 Samarth SochnaPreneurs (SSPs) across 15 states in India.

The Hope1000 project is a collaboration between the Digital Empowerment Foundation (DEF) and the EquallyAble Foundation, building on the success of the earlier Hope1000 program. The project aims to identify and train PwDs in functional digital literacy, equipping them with the necessary digital tools and resources to establish and operate their centers. These centers provide a range of services, including digital literacy training, e-Ticketing facilities, scanning, photocopying, printing services, and assistance with public schemes and entitlements. This report is a reflection of the outcomes, focusing on the changes it has brought about in the lives of PwDs and their communities. It elucidates the economic, social, and educational impacts of the project, as well as the challenges and lessons learned during its implementation. Furthermore, the report will provide valuable insights and recommendations for future initiatives aimed at promoting digital inclusion and empowering PwDs in India and beyond.

SAMARTH SOOCHNAPRENEUR

Hope1000 aims to create 500 Samarth Soochnapreneurs across 15 states in underserved regions with a vision of providing sustainable entrepreneurial opportunities for the person with a disability and facilitating access to rights and entitlements of the community members. Digital Empowerment Foundation will identify persons with physical disabilities to digitally enable them to become sustainable village-level entrepreneurs who not only earn a livelihood for themselves but are also able to serve the community. They will also be trained in functional digital literacy. The person will then be equipped with a tablet phone/desktop/printer scanner and

encouraged to become an entrepreneur who can provide a wide range of digital services to community members. These services could range from digital literacy for community members; eTicketing facility; scanning, photocopying, or printing services; information delivery on public schemes and entitlements; facilitation of application submission for public schemes and entitlements; etc. Hence, this collaboration with EquallyAble Foundation will provide PWDs with an independent profession to support his or her family's livelihood, subsequently providing them with respect and dignity to feel confident and valued.



ACTIVITIES

Identification and Selection of PWDs

The project aimed to identify 500 PWDs across 15 states based on specific selection criteria, prioritizing women with disabilities, those with entrepreneurial mindsets, and individuals with a desire to serve their communities. The selection process ensured that the chosen PWDs would have the potential to become successful SSPs and contribute positively to their communities.



Establishment of Samarth Soochnapreneur (SSP) Centers

The selected PWDs were provided with digital resources, such as tablets or smartphones, desktops or laptops, and printers, as well as support to set up their SSP centers. These centers served as the primary location for the SSPs to offer digital services, digital literacy, information, and entitlement services to their communities.



Training and Capacity Building of SSPs

The project aimed to train the selected PWDs in functional digital literacy and essential entrepreneurial skills. District-level master trainers-cum-coordinators provided training, capacity building, and ongoing support for the SSPs to ensure their success in running their centers and delivering valuable services to their communities.



Provision of Digital Literacy Training to Community Members

One of the key objectives of the project was to enhance digital literacy in the communities served by the SSPs. Each SSP was expected to train at least 50 community members in digital literacy, with a collective goal of training 25,000 community members across all SSP centers.

Delivery of Digital and Entitlement Services to the Community

SSPs were responsible for providing various digital services, such as e-Ticketing facilities, scanning, photocopying, and printing services, to their communities. Additionally, they assisted community members in accessing public schemes and entitlements, ensuring that they could take full advantage of available resources.



Monitoring and Evaluation of Project Outcomes

The project involved continuous monitoring and evaluation of the SSPs' performance, revenue generation, and community outreach to assess the impact of the project and identify areas for improvement. District coordinators conducted field visits and used

DEF's real-time MIS system, MeraApp, to monitor and evaluate project outcomes.

By achieving these objectives, the Hope1000 project aimed to transform the lives of PWDs and their communities, promoting digital inclusion, economic empowerment, and social integration for one of the most marginalized segments of Indian society.

Implementation Process

Implementation process for the project involved several key stages to ensure that the project objectives were met, and the desired outcomes were achieved. The detailed implementation process is outlined below:

The project began with the development of a comprehensive plan, outlining the objectives, specific activities, and expected outcomes. Key stakeholders, including the Digital Empowerment Foundation (DEF), Equally Able Foundation, and district coordinators, were engaged to ensure effective collaboration and coordination throughout the project.

The project team developed specific selection criteria for identifying potential SSPs among persons with disabilities (PWDs). District coordinators were oriented on the project's purpose and the SSP identification process. They identified potential SSPs in their respective regions, and the central team finalized the selection of 500 SSPs in consultation with district coordinators.

With the selected SSPs in place, the project team deployed resources required for setting up SSP centers. This included providing digital tools such as tablets or smartphones,

desktops or laptops, and printers to the SSPs. District coordinators oriented the SSPs to provide hand-holding and training support throughout the project.

The SSPs underwent training in functional digital literacy and essential entrepreneurial skills. District-level master trainers-cum-coordinators provided training and capacity building to the SSPs, ensuring they were equipped with the necessary skills to run their centers successfully and deliver valuable services to their communities.

Each SSP was responsible for training at least 50 community members in digital literacy. District coordinators provided digital literacy training to the SSPs, who then conducted training sessions for community members. The goal was to train 25,000 community members across all SSP centers collectively.

SSPs provided various digital services to their communities, including e-Ticketing facilities, scanning, photocopying, and printing services. They also assisted community members in accessing public schemes and entitlements, ensuring they could take full advantage of available resources.



Key Activities

To successfully implement the project, various activities were conducted. A brief overview of specific interventions made through the centers initiated by Samarth Soochnapreneurs are detailed below.

Digital Literacy

Samarth Soochnapreneurs (SSPs) played a crucial role in promoting digital literacy among community members. These SSPs, who are Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) themselves, underwent comprehensive training in digital literacy before embarking on their mission to empower others in their communities.



The digital literacy classes conducted by SSPs focused on equipping community members with essential digital skills, enabling them to navigate and utilize various digital platforms, devices, and tools effectively. The curriculum covered a wide range of topics, including internet basics, computer and mobile device usage, email communication, social media, online safety, and accessing government services and schemes online.

Through these classes, the SSPs helped bridge the digital divide in underserved regions, providing community members with the knowledge and skills needed to participate

in the digital world confidently. By training 25,000 community members in digital literacy, the SSPs not only contributed to the social and economic development of their regions but also generated additional revenue for themselves.

Digital Didi Initiative

With its focus on empowering persons with disabilities (PWDs) through digital literacy and entrepreneurship, Digital Didi initiative was integrated to address menstrual health and hygiene issues among women and girls in rural communities. The initiative led to enabling of more women and girls in rural areas to access vital information on menstrual health and hygiene.

Digital Financial Inclusion

By focusing on digital and financial literacy, this program has successfully enhanced the skills and knowledge of PWDs and SSPs in various aspects of the digital economy. With access to Chatbot-based Learning Management System, they have been able to overcome information and skill gaps more effectively. This has led to increased inclusivity by extending the benefits of the program to marginalized groups, including economically weaker sections, differently-abled individuals, and minority communities. As a result, PWDs and SSPs are better equipped to navigate the digital world and leverage opportunities for entrepreneurship, employment, and financial growth.

AI for All

The AI for All initiative played a pivotal role in the Hope1000 project by enhancing the understanding and utilization of artificial intelligence among Samarth Soochnapreneurs (SSPs) and persons with disabilities (PWDs). By offering accessible AI education, the program equipped them with





the skills and knowledge required to leverage AI technology in their entrepreneurial endeavors and daily lives. As a result, SSPs and PWDs gained the ability to harness AI-driven tools and solutions, which further optimized their businesses and improved the quality of services provided to their communities. Moreover, the AI for All program also raised awareness of the ethical implications of AI, fostering a responsible and mindful use of technology among PWDs and SSPs. Overall, the initiative significantly contributed to the digital empowerment of these individuals, enabling them to navigate the rapidly evolving technological landscape with confidence and competence.

Social Protection Programme

The program's focus on regular follow-ups with concerned departments further solidified the role of SSPs as reliable facilitators of welfare scheme benefits, ensuring timely and successful delivery of these services. Overall, the Social Protection Program enhanced the skills and impact of SSPs in their communities, making them vital agents of change and champions of social welfare.

Equally Able Foundation

As a supporting organization, the Equally Able Foundation provided funding and strategic guidance for the Hope1000 project.

Digital Empowerment Foundation (DEF)

The DEF was responsible for the overall implementation and management of the Hope1000 project.

The organization engaged with all other stakeholders and coordinated their efforts to ensure the successful execution of the project.

Community Members

Community members were both the recipients of the digital and entitlement services provided by SSPs and played a vital role in creating an inclusive environment for PWDs.

The project team engaged with community members through awareness campaigns, training sessions, and community mobilization efforts to foster acceptance, support, and collaboration with the SSPs.

Private Sector Partners and Technology Providers

Private sector partners and technology providers supplied the necessary digital tools, resources, and support for the project.

The project team engaged with these stakeholders through formal agreements, collaborations, and ongoing communication to ensure that the provided resources were accessible, reliable, and suitable for the needs of the SSPs and the communities they served.





Mehbub Ali is 37 years old, he is from the Malda district of West Bengal. In his family, there are 6 members. Mehub has done 2 master's degrees in different streams. He is PWD (lower limbs not working) and a breadwinner of his family.

For fulfilling the needs of the family he goes 20 km away from his village Mothabari to Malda in the early morning by bus and sells the toys (Khilona). But by selling the toys he is not able to fulfil or meet the financial stability of his family.

After that Mehbub came into contact with the Digital Empowerment Foundation and received a Printer and desktop through the project and opened the center in his respective village.

In this center, he started the photocopy, electricity bills, and railway ticket booking, become the bank correspondence and provide digital banking service to the villagers through the center.

He stated that before the opening of the Soochnapreneur center, the villagers were making fun/joking due to his higher education and selling the toys. But his

financial condition was forcing him to go outside and sell the toys. Also, he said prepared for the competitive exams but he gets failed by attempting several times by a few numbers.

Now, through the center, he provides all the digital and financial services to the villagers and earns income. Due to this work, the villagers get all the digital services in the village and save the hardship to go far away for the same services. From getting motivation from all this action he started digital literacy classes for the village students.

Mehbub tells, by providing digital services to the village community he gets respect in the village and lives a dignified life.

The success of our project in supporting Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) to establish their digital businesses is greatly attributed to our collaborations and partnerships with esteemed organisations such as Amazon, Accenture, USIPI, Intel, Samhita and others.

With the support of Amazon and Accenture, we were able to provide Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) with access to modern technology and digital tools, which will enable them to become entrepreneurs more efficiently and effectively.

Additional support of digital tools such as SkillBot and MeraApp has facilitated building the digital capacities for enhancing their livelihood and financial management capabilities. While the SkillBot is a digital skilling ChatBot for entrepreneurs, their rural entrepreneurship journey was supported with an Android based application, "MeraApp", which is a multilingual app, equipped with central and state scheme information, inbuilt MIS and a revenue tracking feature.

These partnerships have been instrumental in providing the necessary resources, expertise and support to empower and strengthen the program and with this support, we can continue to facilitate positive social change and create a more equitable society.
